• Local Outbreak Control Plans These plans detail how organisations will work together as a system to prevent the spread of coronavirus and respond to any outbreaks across Sussex and Surrey.

As part of the response communications campaigns will be put into action.

Key public messages will be shared across social media, local press as well as digital and outdoor advertising. In the event of a specific outbreak extra control measures will be activated. A rapid response team will issue real time messages to residents and businesses across social media and notify them of any additional action they need to take.

A new Pharmacy Quality Scheme (PQS) for the first part of 2020/21 was announced yesterday (Monday 13 July 2020). The focus of the scheme is ensuring community pharmacy contractors and their teams have put in place all reasonable measures to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic, protecting both themselves and the people using their services. <u>Read more</u>

Modern slavery training

There is significant concern that the pandemic will have exacerbated the threat from modern slavery and human trafficking, with existing victims less visible due to the ongoing closure of some businesses and others at greater risk of becoming victims as their economic circumstances become more precarious as a result of the impact of COVID-19. To help community pharmacy and other organisations which are legally responsible for identifying and referring victims, the Home Office has developed a new training module for first responders. The <u>45-minute programme</u> can be accessed online and can be used alongside existing programmes for training staff about this important work.
