West Sussex TCAM

The West Sussex Transfer of Care Around Medicine (TCAM) swich-on from of discharge information from hospitals to community pharmacy was put back several days due to other pressures in the system. Last week (16 December) it finally went live. Here is our <u>TCAM webpage</u> for more information. We now encourage all contractors in areas where TCAM is live to check their *PharmOutcomes* daily for TCAM notifications and prepare to be ready to deliver the <u>Discharge Medication Service</u> which will be added to the contractual framework in the New Year.

LPC agrees changes to WSCC medicines policy

We told you in November that we were to <u>feed-in views</u> to the next revision of West Sussex County Council Medication Policy in December 2020. The policy supports medicines administration by employed carers in the domiciliary setting.

West Sussex LPC has been successful in seeking to ensure that the policy is aligned with the services commissioned through community pharmacy contractual framework (CPCF) only, or are supported by locally commissioned services (LCS). Several beneficial changes have been made, which will reduce the burden on local pharmacies. The policy will be published for the start of the New Year.

Calls for action

Sexual health & HIV professional survey

Surrey County Council's Sexual Health & HIV Needs Assessment survey for professionals closes on 23 December 2020. The results of the survey are very important as they will form part of the Surrey Sexual Health Needs Assessment 2020, helping to support the sexual health care of all Surrey residents. Only 13 out of Surrey's 209 pharmacies have responded so far. The Survey can be found <u>here.</u> It will take less than five minutes to complete.

Please claim funding and fees you are owed

Insight from commissioners backed up by analysis of claims made tells us that a significant number of pharmacy contractors across Sussex and Surrey are not claiming fees owed to them for the needle exchange services they provide. We urge all participating pharmacies to check that they have claimed the funding they are owed for providing this service. All claims should be submitted via <u>Home Page - PharmOutcomes</u>

Have you signed-up to use NHS Service Finder?

NHS Service Finder is for health care professionals. It is not open to the public but all NHSmail users can speedily obtain login details. The tool enables pharmacy teams to look-up non-public telephone numbers (where available) for listed services, such as general practice by-pass numbers.

Requests from local dentists for Flu Vaccination

There has been a <u>change to the DHSC guidance</u> on the use of their seasonal flu vaccination stock, to allow private vaccinations for frontline health and care workers (not just via occupational health schemes). We have briefed the Local Dental Committees as staff from dental practices may be looking to pharmacies to be vaccinated in the coming weeks.

If your pharmacy is in one of these PCNs, please discuss with your local colleagues who can take on this role, we can help and support this process, contact us on pcn@communitypharmacyss.co.uk

All pharmacies participating in the Pharmacy Quality Scheme part 2 should have completed, or have plans to do the following by 31 January 2021, ahead of the PQS declaration window opening:

- Identify your local PCN, and <u>have details</u> of your local agreed Community Pharmacy PCN lead
- Completed the <u>contractor questionnaire</u> and sent to your Community Pharmacy PCN lead by close of Monday 21st December 2020 latest
- 3. Attended a virtual meeting of contractors in your PCN, organised by your Community Pharmacy PCN lead to discuss local plans
- 4. Be in receipt of your PCN Community Pharmacy Flu Plan and PCN Community Pharmacy Business Continuity Plan from your Community Pharmacy PCN lead. Expect this towards the end of January 2021.
