### Urgent

Views sought on making oral contraceptive available from pharmacies MHRA <u>public consultation</u> on the reclassification of two progestogen-only contraceptive pills containing desogestrel, asks whether they should be available over the counter without a medical prescription. The consultation closes on **Friday 5 March**.

• PSNC has published a <u>briefing on the recent DHSC White Paper</u>, which summarises the key points and identifies some of the implications for our sector:

#### System partners

Top-tier councils across Sussex are working together with the LPCs to offer rapid lateral flow Covid tests at participating community pharmacies and dedicated testing sites

The tests are for everyone who lives or works in Sussex who cannot work from home and who does not have access to a symptom-free test through other routes. Before the symptom-free Community Testing Programme is opened out across Sussex next week, the councils are piloting the programme through a limited number of pharmacies for a few days this week with appointments starting on Thursday 4 March. During the short pilot, staff from Brighton and Hove, East and West Sussex councils, Sussex Police and East and West Fire Services will be offered testing to help trial the booking system and fine tune the way the testing process is managed.

 Pharmacies already contracted to one or more of the councils are eligible to apply to participate in this locally commissioned service and have until 11.59pm on Sunday 7 March, latest, to express an interest

# Help Us, Help You lung cancer campaign launched

The latest phase of the <u>Help Us</u>, <u>Help You campaign</u> urges people worried about possible symptoms of lung cancer to seek advice. It focuses on the key symptom – a cough that lasts for three weeks or more – and aims to reassure people that cancer remains a priority for the NHS.

### Community equipment appeal - Surrey

## Expressions of Interest to be a pharmacy-led C-19 vaccination site

NHS England's regional team received a healthy number of expressions of interest (EOI) before the application deadline on 28 February. There is unlikely to be further communication from NHSE about this until those chosen to be designated as C-19 vaccination sites are notified (probably before 12 March). If you have submitted an EOI and have not heard from NHSEs regional team by 12 March it is unlikely that your application will have been successful.
