Adrenaline auto-injectors pharmaceutical patient waste returns

A reminder that patients are able to return to the pharmacy used or out of date adrenaline auto-injectors e.g. Epipen, Jext. These can be placed into the pharmaceutical waste bins provided by NHSE&I for collection and do not count as sharps waste that would need to be returned via the council sharps waste service.

COVID-19 Vaccination Programme: Publication of Site Designation and Onboarding process and confirmation of key dates

Further to the publication of the NHSEI&I system letter of 22 June 2022 here, and publication of the new draft Enhanced Service Specifications (ES) for Community Pharmacy Contractors for the period from 1 September 2022 to 30 March 2023 (phase 5), they are now able to share with you all the site designation and onboarding process document.

The site designation and onboarding process document can be found here. The document describes the process and timeline for the designation and onboarding of community pharmacy (CP) led COVID-19 vaccination sites for participation in phase 5 of the COVID-19 vaccination programme between September 2022 and March 2023. It should be read by pharmacy contractors wishing to offer the service.

Local Services

Transitional Services Payments

A reminder that to be eligible for the Transitional Services Payments the following needs to be in place (this has been taken from the July Drug Tariff).

Transitional Payments (England only)

- 5.1 From 1 January 2022, pharmacy contractors who dispense 101
 prescription items or more in any month will receive a monthly Transitional
 Payment which consists of two separate payments a dispensing payment
 and a service payment as set out in Table 1.
- 5.2 For the pharmacy contractors to receive the monthly service payment of the transitional payment they must have:
 - (i) claimed for at least one New Medicine Service (NMS) in the previous month; and

 (ii) been registered to provide the Community Pharmacy Consultation Service (CPCS) on the Manage Your Service (MYS) platform for greater than or equal to half of the number of full days in the previous month.

Example 1

For a pharmacy contractor, who dispensed 2,000 prescription items in January 2022, to receive the service payment of £60 they must have claimed for one NMS undertaken in December by the 5 January 2022 and they must have been registered on MYS to provide CPCS for at least 16 days in December 2021.

Example 2

For a pharmacy contractor, who dispensed 6,000 prescription items in March 2022, to receive the service payment of £882 they must have claimed for one NMS undertaken in February by the 5 March 2022 and they must have been registered on MYS to provide CPCS for at least 14 days in February 2022.

• 5.3 Contractors should note that the monthly amount of Transitional Payment may change over the course of the year.

The 2022/23 Community Pharmacy Assurance Framework (CPAF) screening questionnaire will be available for completion from approximately 1am on **Monday 18th July 2022** until midnight on **Wednesday 31st August 2022**.

Completion of CPAF is now a requirement of contractors' Terms of Service.

Therefore, contractors must complete the screening questionnaire and, if required, the full CPAF questionnaire. PSNC has published a Briefing to provide guidance on the screening process.
