West Sussex Locally Commissioned Service: Smoking and NHS Healthchecks

We are delighted to announce that your LPC has negotiated a substantial increase with the commissioner who has agreed an uplift in fees for provision of these services. This will be applied to the new contracts starting on the 1st of April.

Renumeration for the NHS Healthcheck service non-priority tariff is a 16% uplift and for priority groups a 69% uplift on the current delivery model.

Renumeration for the Stop smoking service non-priority tariff is a 72% uplift and for priority groups a 95% uplift based on the current CO Verified delivery model.

Surrey Dynamic Purchasing System

In order to provide the Surrey Public Health services, Surrey County Council required all pharmacies to register on the ProActis Portal. Once registered you can bid for the services you wish to be commissioned for your pharmacy. Please ensure you do this before the **31st of March 2023.**

HEE independent Prescriber courses

- The support of an identified designated prescribing practitioner (DPP).
- An appropriate practice-based learning environment in a prescribing setting that can offer appropriate clinical support.

- Commitment to use the skill within your area of competence and expertise, for the delivery of NHS clinical services as they emerge.

Metolazone tablets - Caution needed when dispensing

Metolazone 2.5 mg tablets are only available as an unlicensed product for any prescriptions requesting 2.5mg tablets. However, for the metolazone 5mg strength there is now a new licensed product available called Xaqua – if a prescription has been written generically for the 5mg strength please check with the prescriber which product is required as the new licensed product has a bioavailability twice that of the unlicensed medication, Zaroxoyln. A dose change may be needed when changing from the unlicensed product to the new licensed product. If the unlicensed product is required a new prescription by Brand name would need to be generated.
