Community Pharmacy IP Pathfinder

The three ICB's covered by CPSS – Sussex ICB, Surrey Heartlands ICB and Frimley ICB have all expressed interest to NHSE to provide a community pharmacy based independent prescriber service. These expressions of interest will now be reviewed by NHSE at a Regional level in March and a National level in April. After this we will find out if any of the expressions of interest have been successful.

As soon as we hear we will let you know the outcome and whether the system will be progressing with an IP service within your area.

Community Pharmacy study on advice to pregnant woman

Kings College London are conducting a study the purpose of which is to explore the types of advice community pharmacists provide to women with Nausea and Vomiting in Pregnancy, their confidence in providing this advice and their knowledge surrounding pharmacological therapy. An additional aim is to explore methods by which community pharmacists could be better supported in terms of education, resources, and continued professional development.

Did you know?

...Surrey Heartlands Integrated Care Board (ICB) have a **Controlled Drugs Monitoring Group**? Using data, the team can see the overall landscape of Controlled Drugs prescribing across Surrey. Areas of focus have included:

 Prescribing for over 30 days – It is strongly recommended that prescribing of Controlled Drugs should be for no more than 30 days at a time. Do you challenge prescribers who routinely prescribe Controlled Drugs for more than 30 days?

- **Prescribing of large or excessive quantities** Are you assured that directions are correct on prescriptions? Do you challenge prescribers when receiving prescriptions for large quantities of liquids or tablets where quantities appear to be excessive?
- <u>Controlled Drugs not usually prescribed in primary care</u> e.g., methadone and ketamine – Do you challenge if presented with an FP10 for a Controlled Drug that would usually only be prescribed by specialists in either secondary or tertiary services?
- Paramedic prescribing of Controlled Drugs Paramedics are not legally allowed to prescribe any Controlled Drug in schedules 1-5. Never dispense a prescription for Controlled Drugs prescribed by a paramedic, return the prescription and request that the item be reviewed and/or prescribed by an appropriate person.
- Fraudulent prescriptions Be extra vigilant when paper FP10 prescriptions for Controlled Drugs are presented at the pharmacy, especially at unusual times of the week or day. Query any prescriptions for Controlled Drugs that are not signed by a prescriber, or where handwriting requirements are not met. In situations where you suspect a prescription may be fraudulent follow local procedures for reporting.
