Asthma Friendly Schools Surrey

This is an initiative put in place in Surrey Heartlands ICB to award schools who meet the criteria the Asthma Friendly status.

Pharmacies may see an increase in schools who are asking for salbutamol inhalers and spacers to be purchased under this criterion. It is therefore important that all

community pharmacies refresh their knowledge of supplying salbutamol inhalers under a signed order to schools. This is covered by the MHRA as an exemption as a small volume, one-off, not for profit sale and does not require a wholesaler dealer license.

From 1st October 2014, the <u>Human Medicines (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations 2014[2]</u> allows schools to buy salbutamol inhalers, without a prescription, for use in emergencies (see <u>here</u> for more information).

A pharmacy can sell the salbutamol inhaler and spacers in small quantities, but the school will need to provide a signed order by the principal or head teacher (ideally on appropriately headed paper) stating: - the name of the school for which the product is required; - the purpose for which that product is required, and - the total quantity required.

Schools may wish to discuss with pharmacies the different plastic spacers available and what is most appropriate for the age-group in the school and to ask for advice on correct use of the inhaler.

Asthma Friendly School Status

The school recognises that asthma is a widespread, serious, but controllable condition. This school welcomes all pupils with asthma and aims to support these children in participating fully in school life. The school will endeavor to do this by ensuring they have:

- an asthma register
- up-to-date asthma policy,
- an asthma lead/champion,
- all pupils must always have immediate access to their reliever inhaler and spacer,
- all pupils have an up-to-date asthma action plan, or Individual Health Care
 Plan (IHCP) thinking of those children without diagnosis
- an emergency salbutamol inhaler and spacer with corresponding paperwork
- ensure all staff have regular asthma training,
- promote asthma awareness pupils, parents and staff.

New advice - Topical testosterone (Testogel)

The <u>Drug safety Update – March 2023</u> contains information about a risk of harm to children following accidental exposure to Topical testosterone (Testogel). Premature puberty and genital enlargement have been reported in children who were in close physical contact with an adult using topical testosterone and who were repeatedly accidentally exposed to this medicine. To reduce these risks, advise patients to:

- wash their hands after application of topical testosterone.
- cover the application site with clothing once the product has dried.
- wash the application site before physical contact with another adult or child.

Remember! that care also needs to be taken with other topical hormone products such as Oestrogen gels and creams.

Action taken by the Surrey Heartlands Medicines Safety Committee:

Following discussions with a Medicines Safety Committee Patient Representative, the Head of Medicines safety has contacted the manufacturer of Testogel providing feedback on how the Patient Information Leaflet (PIL) can be made clearer to patients. These comments have been passed on to the manufacturer's Medicines Information team who regularly review and update PILs.
