Signposting - Support isolated people to self-refer for volunteer calls

People who would benefit from extra social contact can now self-refer for free 'Check In and Chat' phone calls from the NHS Volunteer Responders by calling 0808 196 3646. Alternatively, <u>clinicians and other primary care colleagues can directly refer</u> <u>people</u> with their consent. <u>GP practices and pharmacies can also order pre-printed posters</u> and flyers to promote self-referral.

The 'Check In and Chat' service involves volunteers phoning patients for a friendly

chat. Where appropriate, they can encourage people to make positive changes and share information about other local services. People with additional vulnerabilities should be referred for Check In and Chat Plus to be linked with a DBS-checked volunteer.

Surrey Heartlands Care leavers prepayment prescription scheme

As part of Surrey's offer to care leavers Surrey Heartlands Integrated Care Board and Surrey County Council are working in partnership to provide care leavers **who are** <u>not</u> **already entitled** to free prescriptions a pre-payment certificate, so that they do not need to pay for prescription items prescribed for them.

For young people to be eligible for this scheme they need to fulfil the following criteria: -

- Be registered with a GP.
- Be a care leaver and eligible to receive a leaving care service from Surrey County Council.
- Be 18 25 years old.
- Require repeat prescriptions for ongoing medication.
- Not already be exempt from prescription charges.

e.g. Young people eligible will include.

- Young person in apprenticeship or work.
- Young person earning more than £15 276 per annum.

The young person will need to contact their personal advisor for support on how to apply for the pre-payment prescription certificate. The personal advisor will arrange funding to be paid directly to the young person so that they can purchase their pre-payment certificate directly from <u>https://services.nhsbsa.nhs.uk/buy-prescription-prepayment-certificate/start</u>.
