

Pharmacy Pressures Survey 2024: Please take part

Community Pharmacy England has launched its third annual Pressures Survey, and CPSS is asking local pharmacy business owners and staff members to please respond.

The situation is now critical for community pharmacy owners and teams in Surrey and Sussex and we know this is severely impacting on workloads, stress levels, patients, and businesses. The 2024 Pharmacy Pressures Survey aims to find out more about this and other areas such as medicines supply issues, workforce challenges, and the recently launched Pharmacy First service.

Alongside Community Pharmacy England, CPSS is putting every effort into making policy makers aware of the serious issues in our sector and urging them to take action to ease the pressures. This year's survey will provide important information to support this.

The survey results will be critical to help highlight to both Government and the NHS how difficult things now are for community pharmacies. Community Pharmacy England will be using the results both in negotiations and in national media work. They and CPSS will also use these in conversations with MPs.

Once again there are two separate surveys, one for pharmacy business owners/head office representatives, and the other for pharmacy teams. The

surveys are as short as possible, taking around **10-15 minutes** to complete. They will be open until **23.59 on Tuesday 2nd April.**

Check Your Health Day - Burgess Hill

On Saturday 2nd March, Burgess Hill Town Council hosted a 'Check Your Health' day at a local hall allowing Burgess Hill residents to get their blood pressure and blood glucose levels tested.


Community Pharmacy Surrey and Sussex along with our local pharmacy team from S.C. Williams Pharmacy attended the event to conduct the blood pressure checks. We did a total of 46 blood pressure checks, 8 of which were found to be high and referred for ABPMs. Of the 46 we found that 2 residents presented with very high blood pressure and were referred to A&E.

This highlighted the importance of having this event as many of the residents explained they would not have had their blood pressure checked otherwise and

majority of those found to have high blood pressure had not had their blood pressure checked for almost a year.

The event also gave us the opportunity to discuss some healthy lifestyle interventions and provide advice on how to check blood pressure and what the numbers mean.

A huge thank you to our pharmacy team for supporting this successful event!

Management Pharmacist CGL and Tina Fowler Pharmacy Liaison Lead CGL who shared the evaluation results of the MAT core service, notified contractors of the changed fee structure, training requirements and offered a chance for any questions.

Sussex ICB Palliative Care service – reminder quarterly stock check claim form due

Thank you for delivering the EOLC LCS and for your commitment to ensuring prompt and reliable access to palliative medicines for our patients. The quarterly stock check form is now due to be submitted. Reminder that the return of stock reporting information on a quarterly basis is a requirement of the LCS and that failure to return your stock reporting information by the deadline may lead to a suspension of payment for any activities undertaken as part of this LCS until such time the required audit(s) is received.

Discharge Medicine Service (DMS)

DMS became an essential part of the Community Pharmacy Contractual Framework in February 2021. We wrote out to our Surrey contractors at the beginning of February 2024 advising that they can expect to see an increase in referrals for this service. This is due to the fact the **Ashford and St Peters and Royal Surrey Foundation Trusts** recently procured a joint PharmOutcomes license enabling them to send DMS referrals into community pharmacy.

Whilst our pharmacy teams will be familiar with this service already, we, along with our hospital colleagues put together a 'refresher video' for the service.

NHSBSA extends Pharmacy First submission deadline after technical issue

The NHS Business Services Authority (NHSBSA) has confirmed that the deadline for pharmacy owners to make their claims for February Pharmacy First consultations has been extended **until 5pm on Friday 15th March 2024**.

This is an extended deadline for February only (this includes any consultations completed on 31st January 2024) and it follows an issue with Pharmacy First claims appearing incorrectly in the NHSBSA Manage Your Service (MYS) portal. NHSBSA has advised that the issue is now resolved; however as always pharmacy owners should check their submission carefully before submitting.

TV campaign to encourage blood pressure checks in community pharmacy

Primary care teams are encouraged to support a new campaign to help detect the estimated 4.2 million people in England with undiagnosed hypertension <u>using free</u>

resources on the Campaign Resource Centre website including printed pharmacy toolkits, social media assets, digital screens and a communications toolkit.

High blood pressure (hypertension) is the single biggest treatable risk factor for cardiovascular disease including heart attacks, strokes and dementia. However high blood pressure usually has no symptoms, which is why from 11 March, a TV campaign will encourage those aged 40 and over, to get a free blood pressure check at the nearest participating pharmacy.
