

Sussex Downs Health Care Webinar on Diagnosing Ovarian Cancer Earlier in Sussex - Friday 18th October at 13:00 – 14:00

Join Dr Victoria Barber, Ms. Sonali Kaushik & Dr Charlotte Badescue who will cover how ovarian cancer can present in primary care, focusing on symptom recognition, tests/guidance, family history considerations, common diagnostic challenges, and top tips for improving GP referrals, with case studies to highlight key points

Speakers Bio:

Dr Victoria Barber has been a GP for 18 years in a practice in Rushden,
Northamptonshire. She has a particular interest in women's health and was
involved in the British Medical Journal's GP educational tool on ovarian cancer. Her
mother died from ovarian cancer in 2014 and Victoria has run the London
Marathon and cycled from Lands End to John o'Groats to raise money for Target
Ovarian Cancer.

Ms. Sonali Kaushik is a Consultant Gynaecologist and Gynae-oncology Surgeon based in Brighton & Hove.

Her main area of expertise is in diagnosis and management of conditions of the female genital tract, including benign disease, pre-cancer, and cancer. She is one of the 150 other specialists in the UK, who are formally accredited by the RCOG to undertake complex gynaecological cancer surgery. In 2013, she received the National Cancer Research Institute (NCRI) Prize for her research on the analysis of quality of care received by women with gynaecological cancer. In addition to numerous national & international presentations, she has authored several research papers in peer reviewed journals.

Dr Charlotte Badescu is an NHS GP in the North West of England and a Cancer Fellow at the Greater Manchester Cancer Alliance. Her special interests include dermatology and women's health. Charlotte became a member of Target Ovarian Cancer's Primary Care Advisory Board following her own diagnosis in 2021. She is

passionate about trying to improve ovarian cancer awareness and treatment through using her experience as both a patient and a GP.

Community Pharmacy Foundation Trainee Pharmacist Prescribing Training Pilot

In 2025 foundation trainee pharmacists will, during their foundation training year, be required to complete 90hours of Learning in Practice (LiP) time related to prescribing and be signed off by their DPP.

The pilot project aims to:

Co-create a novel, tailored prescribing training approach for trainee pharmacists in community pharmacy based on Pharmacy First & other pharmacy services

Its looking to evaluate and explore the feasibility of foundation trainee pharmacists demonstrating transferrable prescribing skills, which could count towards their 90hours of LiP time within a typical community pharmacy setting.

NHSE WTE are looking for pharmacists (prescriber or non-prescriber) and foundation trainee pharmacist (FTP) pairs to participate in the pilot.

Change in prescribing to Trurapi

Frimley Healthcare Foundation Trust are moving toward initiating Trurapi insulin over Novorapid, Surrey Heartlands systems have already moved in this direction. Frimley ICB are likely to follow next year, however the hospital has started the move in advance, so prescribing will be coming out of the hospital.

To support use of the Trurapi cartridges, Sanofi wanted to remind community pharmacies that the DTP Portal for allocations and prescription overrides may be used for the Allstar PRO silver and blue insulin pens, which are currently in short

supply and may be used with Trurapi.

Pharmacies will need to create an account using your postcode, email and Phoenix/ AAH account number that can be found on their invoice.



University Hospitals Sussex - Change in prescribing to Inhixa

UHSx have standardised their Low Molecular Weight Heparin (LMWH) by transitioning from dalteparin (Fragmin) to enoxaparin (Inhixa) across their sites. You may therefore expect to see an increase in demand for enoxaparin (Inhixa), some of which may be time sensitive.

Hospitals are issuing FP10H prescriptions to their outpatient patients, pharmacies will see a higher number of outpatient Rxs for Inhixa than usual particularly around the Worthing and St Richards hospital areas.
