Community Pharmacy - PharmacyTechnician Apprenticeship (CPTA) Programme Funding

We are excited to announce the launch of the Community Pharmacy – Pharmacy Technician Apprenticeship Programme.

Upon completion of training and registration with the General Pharmaceutical Council (GPhC) this will support community pharmacy to utilise the expertise and knowledge of registered pharmacy technicians as part of pharmacy services and wider reform.

Funding Offer

We are offering a training contribution of £15,053 per trainee per year for two years to support sites in developing a PTPT programme that meets the <u>GPhC IET standards for pharmacy technicians</u> and the <u>NHS England Education Quality Framework.</u>

Next Steps

Application for funding is via expression of interest (EoI) submitted via an <u>online application form</u>. The application window will open from Monday 23 September 2024 until Sunday 13 October 2024.





Accuracy Checking



The aim of this unit is to give learners the knowledge (which is taught in the first year) and the technical skills needed to be able to assemble and check dispensed medicines and products.



The unit covers the process that learners are required to follow, along with the necessary checks of their own and others' assembled medicines and products.



It also covers the process for dealing with errors and the requirements for recording and reporting.
