Integrated Referral Service - Booking and Referral Standard: For Regional Digital and Regional Senior Pharmacy Integration Leads

Integrated referral service update

Sonar Informatics will be live using the integrated referral service, joining Cegedim Healthcare Solutions, EMIS (PharmOutcomes), and Positive Solutions (HxConsult) as an assured community pharmacy IT supplier. This enables Pharmacy First referrals from general practice to integrate directly into pharmacy workflows.

Supported GP IT Systems

- EMIS Web
- EMIS PharmRefer

For Sonar Users: Referrals from EMIS PharmRefer and EMIS Web Local Services now go directly into Sonar, enhancing the efficiency of Pharmacy First referrals. If a referral does not appear in Sonar, it will automatically be resent by email. Referrals from non-EMIS systems will continue to be received as usual (typically by email). For TPP SystemOne Users: Referrals will continue through NHSmail or PharmRefer (where licenced). Work is underway with TPP to develop and adopt the national Referral Standard.

Support process: Community pharmacy teams must raise any technical queries or

live service issue with the relevant IT supplier. Suppliers then raise live service issues with the National Service Desk following the NHS England <u>incident and</u> <u>service request process - NHS Digital</u>.

The new PNA is currently being drafted for publishing by October 2025. To support the drafting of the PNA the pharmacy contractor survey has now been sent out to all pharmacies in the area via your pharmacy NHS email and is also available on the link below.

CPSS negotiated for the number of questions sent out to pharmacies to be significantly reduced compared to previous years due to the current workload. Reducing Health Inequalities: Inclusion of people with a learning disability and autistic people in tobacco dependency support and universal prevention services webinar

You are invited to attend the webinar on Wednesday 5th February 2pm-:30pm

An opportunity to hear from people with a learning disability on how to provide accessible support. People with learning disabilities and autistic people continue to face health inequalities, die younger than the general population, and be twice as likely to die of a preventable condition. The top three causes of death are cardiovascular disease, respiratory disease, and cancer - smoking is a leading risk factor for all three.

This webinar supports the thinking about what reasonable adjustments you can make to improve access to prevention services and help reduce these health inequalities.


The training will be co-delivered by the Speak Out's Thumbs Up trainers who have lived experience of a learning disability, and they will discuss:

- The barriers people with a learning disability and autistic people face when trying to access mainstream services.
- What reasonable adjustments are and how they can be used to reduce these barriers.
- How a specialist tobacco dependency service has developed reasonably adjusted support in their care for people with a learning disability and autistic people.

• How you can follow their example and adjust your service to promote better access.

There will also be accessible resources shared that you could use.

Pharmacy early careers funding scoping survey - response needed by 20th December

NHS England South East Workforce Training and Education (SE WT+E) pharmacy has allocated some funding to support education and development of early careers pharmacy workforce within each Integrated Care System (ICS) in the South East.

Early Careers refers to the initial period where pharmacists and pharmacy technicians begin their professional development journey in practice, until they develop their skills prior to advance practice. This Early Careers funding is for **postregistration** pharmacy professionals, including those moving into a new sector or returning from a career break.

This survey provides a mean to **scope the provision** of this funding for the SE region and locally at system-level.

Your responses will help make recommendations and determine how best to utilise the funding across all sectors to benefit the pharmacy workforce.

Data will be shared with the ICS MO Board or equivalent for agreement of requests and development of a Pharmacy Workforce Plan and allocation of funding.
