Local Services



Surrey Heartlands ICB - Pharmacy Contraception Service Surrey Heartlands ICB have identified 13,000 patients who are prescribed oral contraception ONLY and are providing information to GP Practices to support communication regarding the service. GP Practices will be able to send Text messages/e-mails to all these patients to advise they can obtain future supplies from a Community Pharmacy of their choice using the Find a Pharmacy link. We have advised that if a GP Practice has a number of patients these are sent in batches of 50 per week.

This text will be sent to all eligible patients

Get repeat oral contraception at a pharmacy without needing to see a GP. Find a pharmacy that offers the contraceptive pill without a prescription www.nhs.uk/service-search/pharmacy/find-a-pharmacy-offering-contraceptive-pill-without-prescription.

Please could you consider the following actions

- Patients will walk in to access the service, please ensure all staff are briefed
- Review your current engagement and plan for additional training if required
- Make sure all your pharmacists are trained including locum pharmacist
- Consider what other members of the team could do to support the pharmacist to deliver the service
- You must provide contraception initiation if you register to provide the service
- Review your marketing, social media, website
- Make sure your team understand the service and is well engaged

Surrey Safeguarding - Information on what adult abuse is and what to do if someone, is being abused or neglected.

Many people in Surrey live safely, free from abuse and are able to protect themselves from further risk. However, some people have care and support needs that make it difficult for them to protect themselves from abuse and neglect. In these circumstances, they may need help and support to keep themselves safe. This may include people who are frail, people with physical disabilities, learning disabilities, long term conditions, mental ill health, autistic people and people who misuse alcohol or substances.

Safeguarding adults is about protecting a person's right to live in safety, free from abuse and neglect.

Sussex ICB - Guidance for the management of the shortage of medicines used to treat attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD)

<u>A National Patient Safety Alert (NPSA)</u> on the shortage of medicines used for the treatment attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) was issued in September 2023. The supply issues have been ongoing since then and stock availability has been intermittent.

The guide <u>here</u> is designed to aide prescribers and make appropriate switches where alternatives are available.

Please note that Sussex Medicines Management Team advise that it is only Methylphenidate MR tablets that can be prescribed generically, all capsules must be prescribed by brand. Methylphenidate MR capsules are not interchangeable with Methylphenidate MR tablets due to significantly different IR:MR split formulations.



Reminder - Emergency supplies of fidaxomicin used for treatment of Clostridioides difficile infection

There have been some issues with obtaining fidaxomicin on or at weekends and Bank Holidays due to the delivery schedules of wholesalers. The manufacturers of fidaxomicin have advised that an emergency ordering service is available via Alliance. Community pharmacists may access this free service on 0330 100 0449.

Note Surrey Heartlands ICB commission a service and selected pharmacies across the geography keep fidaxomicin in stock – if you are based in Surrey and unaware of which pharmacies stock it for signposting to if needed, please contact us at <u>lpc@communitypharmacyss.co.uk</u>.
