Free online training for pharmacy staff Training for pharmacy staff on the EHC, Chlamydia and Gonorrhoea testing programme in Surrey, to provide an overview of Sexually Transmitted Infections, to provide a clear understanding of the free condom scheme for under 25's and support the training requirements of the service specification. This is for commissioned pharmacies and those who wish to sign up.

Aim

These sessions will provide training for the EHC, Chlamydia and Gonorrhoea testing Programme in Surrey. By Gaining an overview of Sexually Transmitted Infections and Contraception, including Emergency Contraception, PEP and PrEP and how to provide Chlamydia and Gonorrhoea test kits.

Objectives

- By the end of the session participants will:
- Understand how the Condom Distribution Scheme works
- Know who can access the scheme
- Know how young people access condoms
- Know how the C-Card is used
- Have knowledge of condom varieties, and effective usage

• Know where to get help if needed.



Sussex Respiratory Network Training Day on Tuesday 13th May 2025 9:00am-4:30pm at Brighton Racecourse, Freshfield Rd, Brighton and Hove, Brighton BN2 9XZ

The day is aimed at any clinician with an interest in updating and improving their respiratory skills and knowledge, as well as getting to know local colleagues and specialists. There will be lots of opportunities to ask questions and share learning.

Keynote sessions include the updated NICE asthma guidelines (diagnosis and treatment), managing difficult asthma, bronchiectasis and complex infections.

There will be a choice of smaller group sessions in the afternoon with topics including the new Sussex Respiratory Medicines Chapter, spirometry skills session, COPD, and interstitial lung disease - ILD.

The sessions will be delivered by multi-professional specialist clinicians who practice in Sussex.

Learning Outcomes

Core Sessions:

1. To understand the rationale behind the updated (Nov. 2024) NICE/BTS/SIGN asthma guidelines re. asthma diagnosis and management and to feel confident in applying them in clinical practice.

2. To understand options (including referral for biologic treatment) for people with a diagnosis of asthma who have symptoms that are difficult to control.

3. To understand when to suspect bronchiectasis. To understand the rationale for investigations and treatment plans for patients with bronchiectasis.

4. To understand what may need to be considered if respiratory infection symptoms

do not resolve with 1st and 2nd line antibiotic treatments.
