LFD service changes

Following an update to the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) guidance on antiviral treatment for COVID-19, which removes some of the cohorts of patients eligible for these treatments, these changes will also need to be reflected in the Lateral Flow Device (LFD) service.

The changes in the NICE guidance means the following patient cohorts are **no longer eligible** to receive free LFD tests through the service:

- People aged 85 years and over
- People with end-stage heart failure who have a long-term ventricular assistance device
- People on the organ transplant waiting list
- People resident in a care home who are aged 70 years and over
- People resident in a care home who have a BMI of 35 kg/m2 or more
- People resident in a care home who have diabetes
- People resident in a care home who have heart failure
- People currently in a hospital who are aged 70 years and over
- People currently in a hospital who have a BMI of 35 kg/m2 or more
- People currently in a hospital who have diabetes
- People currently in a hospital who have heart failure

Pharmacy owners are asked to brief their teams on the changes to the eligible patient cohorts for the service, update their standard operating procedure (SOP)

for the service and stop supplying LFD tests to the above patient groups **by**Monday 16th June 2025.

Important message for pharmacies who provide the Locally commissioned Vapes service in Brighton

Issuing vapes is an element of the smoking cessation service in Brighton, this allows pharmacies to issue a Totally Wicked voucher to a person who is trying to quit smoking so they can use vapes as part of their smoking cessation journey. It is important to ensure that all staff providing the service are aware of this and offer vapes to the patient in accordance with the service specification.

Vapes are considered a support aid for a person who is trying to quit:

- Vaping is significantly less harmful than smoking, and
- It is endorsed as the best alternative for smokers who are unable or unwilling to quit using other methods.

The below training and guidance are available below for pharmacy teams;

- 1. <u>Support for the Swap to Stop programme, with encouragement to actively promote it.</u>
- Accurate guidance on vaping, based on evidence.
 Training available via the National Centre for Smoking Cessation and Training (NCSCT).

Funding for Community Pharmacy Technician Apprenticeship Programme 2025: Deadline 15 June 2025

NHS WTE are excited to announce the launch of the Community Pharmacy
Technician Apprenticeship Programme 2025. This programme will support Preregistration Trainee Pharmacy Technicians (PTPTs) to be employed and complete
their 24-month apprenticeship training within a **community pharmacy setting.**Upon completion of training and registration with the General Pharmaceutical
Council (GPhC) the registered pharmacy technicians' will be able to utilise their
expertise and knowledge to support community pharmacies in various ways,
including contributing to the delivery of pharmacy services and broader healthcare
reforms.

Funding Offer

We are offering a training contribution of £15,053 per trainee, per year for two years (24 months) to support community pharmacies in developing a PTPT programme that meets the GPhC IET standards for pharmacy technicians (PDF only, 713KB) and the NHS England Education Quality Framework.

Next Steps

Application for funding is through an expression of interest (EoI) submitted via an online application form. The application window will open on Monday 19 May 2025 until Sunday 15 June 2025.

CPPE Launches hands-on workshop to strengthen hypertension case-finding in Community Pharmacy

CPPE are pleased to announce the launch of a new face-to-face workshop designed to enhance the skills and confidence of pharmacy professionals delivering the NHS Hypertension Case-Finding Service.

The workshop, Blood pressure assessment in community pharmacy: essential skills, will take place on Sunday 29 June from 10:30am to 13:00pm at The Sandman Hotel, 18-23 Tinsley Lane South, Three Bridges, Crawley, RH10 8XH

The workshop will be delivered in collaboration with the British and Irish Hypertension Society (BIHS), the event combines clinical expertise with practical, real-world application.

This new workshop supports pharmacy professionals at all stages – whether launching the service or looking to refine existing practice. It offers the opportunity to learn practical skills on using ABPM equipment, interpreting blood pressure readings, and managing consultations through a person-centred, shared decision-making approach.

Attendees will also benefit from learning how to train wider pharmacy teams, ensuring consistent delivery and embedding the service into everyday practice.

Key learning outcomes include:

- Identifying eligible individuals for the service
- Demonstrating and interpreting BP and ABPM assessments
- Providing lifestyle advice and promoting behaviour change
- Creating a team training plan
- Using person-centred communication to build trust and engagement

With limited places available, early booking is recommended. CPPE encourages pharmacists, pharmacy technicians, and trainee pharmacists to attend and use this opportunity to network, upskill, and strengthen their contribution to public health through effective hypertension management.

Frimley ICB – Looking for a DPP - Expression of Interest for Teach & Treat

Frimley ICB is planning to run a **"Teach and Treat Programme"** locally. This project aims to create a **sustainable** and **effective** Teach and Treat model that provides comprehensive training and development opportunities for IP learners.

They plan to utilise **community pharmacy hub sites** with trained Designated Prescribing Practitioners (DPPs) to offer more placements and **better access to DPPs** for community pharmacists who are undertaking the Independent Prescribing (IP) qualification. Their aim is to develop a develop a scalable model

that can be expanded in the future based on the success of the initial implementation, with potential for additional community pharmacy sites and increased learner capacity as the number of active IPs and DPPs in community pharmacy grows, partly driven by this project.

Community pharmacy hub sites will be supported by trained Designated
Prescribing Practitioners (DPPs) who are supported by DPP mentors, to facilitate
direct patient care alongside mentorship and supervision.

Attached <u>here</u> is a master CPSS training tracker to help support you log completions for PQS required modules.

You can print this out / save this and have it at the front of your PQS training folder!

Remember to add all training records and certificates for all your staff members to this folder for assurance checks.

Note for anyone who has completed the CPPE Sepsis training outside of the specified PQS time period, the training will need to be accessed again. If the assessment only is accessed and completed, the individuals PQS record on CPPE will show the PQS sepsis training as incomplete.

Surrey Heartlands ICB – the new Joint Formulary & PAD will be launched on Thursday 22nd May and will replace the existing PAD and the local Trust's formularies.

Users of the Surrey PAD will automatically be redirected to the new platform so there is no need to worry about using a different link.

More information, including some screen shots and some FAQs, have been placed on the current PAD: <u>Guidelines</u>: <u>Surrey Heartlands Joint Formulary & PAD</u>.

A few key points to note:

- Searches are conducted in the same way, using a drug name, condition or commonly used term.
- The most significant difference for current PAD users will be the introduction of a Formulary page. The Formulary page is what you will see after conducting a search.
- If you wish to access the PAD page (where documents are stored, committee decisions and further information) you simply click on the drug name on the Formulary page
- There are many more drugs and indications in the new Joint Formulary compared to the existing PAD. The Joint Formulary includes the drugs that are on the PAD plus the formularies of ASPH, RSFT, SASH and SABP
- There are a number of therapeutic areas that are still under review, and these will be listed in the News feed on the new platform. The most significant being Nutrition, Mental Health and Skin which should be completed within the next 2-3 months.

The new platform has a Contact Us feature that is accessible from the home page. Please use this to let them know if you come across anything that you think isn't quite right or if you wish to provide feedback on the platform itself.

A webinar is being planned for early June where a demonstration of the new Joint Formulary platform will be provided and the opportunity to answer any questions. Details will follow.
