NMS Claim Change on MYS	Pharmacy Income	Reminder for May claim	<p>Ahead of making a claim for the New Medicine Service (NMS) consultations carried out in May 2025, pharmacy owners are reminded of the changes to the service's payment structure that came into effect last month. The payment structure for NMS will be simplified to a £14 fee for each Intervention or Follow up consultation provided to the patient, i.e. a total fee of £28 will be paid if the pharmacy has done both the Intervention and Follow up consultations. For claims for NMS provided in <b>April and subsequent months, up until that change is made to MYS</b>, pharmacy owners will need to claim the total number of Intervention consultations and Follow up consultations they have provided in the month. For example:</p> <p>Number of completed Intervention consultations – 20            Number of completed Follow up consultations – 11            Number of NMS provisions to be claimed in the MYS module – 31.</p> <p>Once the NHSBSA have updated the MYS module, pharmacy owners will be able to separately report on the number of Intervention consultation and Follow up consultations, with the NHSBSA making payment based on the total number of each.</p> <p><a href="#">Learn more here.</a></p>

Community Pharmacy Technician Apprenticeship Programme	Pharmacy Income	Complete by 15 <sup>th</sup> June 2025	<p>The Community Pharmacy Technician Apprenticeship Programme 2025 will support Pre-registration Trainee Pharmacy Technicians (PTPTs) to be employed and complete their 24-month apprenticeship training within a <b>community pharmacy setting</b>. Upon completion of training and registration with the General Pharmaceutical Council (GPhC) the registered pharmacy technicians' will be able to utilise their expertise and knowledge to support community pharmacies in various ways, including contributing to the delivery of pharmacy services and broader healthcare reforms.</p> <p><b>Funding Offer</b>            NHS WTE are offering a training contribution of <b>£15,053 per trainee, per year for two years</b> (24 months) to support community pharmacies in developing a PTPT</p>

<b>LFD Service</b>	<b>Pharmacy Income</b>	<b>By the 16<sup>th</sup> June 2025</b>	<p>As a reminder, NICE guidance on antiviral treatment for C-19 was amended on 1st May, removing some of the cohorts of patients eligible for these treatments. This follows changes to the pricing of Paxlovid introduced by Pfizer.</p> <p>CPE have discussed the corresponding changes to the LFD service which need to be made with NHS England; the required changes are simply to remove reference to eligible groups of patients that were added to the eligible cohort last year. Consequently, the eligible groups for the LFD service return to those that were included when the service was first commissioned.</p> <p>NHS England have agreed a four week notice period for pharmacy owners to allow them to brief staff and to update their SOP for the service. The financial quarters are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 1st April to 30th June</li> <li>• 1st July to 30th September</li> <li>• 1st October to 31st December</li> <li>• 1st January to 31st March</li> </ul> <p>Reminder of the new <a href="#">NHS Profile Manager tool for updating DoS &amp; NHS website</a>.</p> <p>Note the NHS Terms of Service require pharmacy owners to check that their opening hours, contact information, facilities and services information are up to date for each profile, each financial quarter. Check that each module is marked as verified even if no change is required to the information. All boxes must be ticked in the NHS profile Manager otherwise it will be marked as incomplete. The facilities section is the most often missed profile for confirmation.</p>	
Data Security and Protection Toolkit	Contractual Requirement	Complete by 30 <sup>th</sup> June 2025	<p>Community Pharmacy England has published new guidance to help pharmacy owners complete this year's Data Security and Protection Toolkit. The Toolkit is used to make a pharmacy's information governance (IG) declaration and must be completed <b>by Friday 30th June 2025</b>.</p> <p>CPE collaborated with the NHS Toolkit team to keep the workload associated with Toolkit completion manageable whilst maintaining the appropriate data security protections. The updated Toolkit includes a new question on multi-factor authentication for clinical IT systems, improved layout and question wording, pharmacy-specific tips, and pre-filled answers from previous submissions for easier updates.</p> <p>We recommend that you log in to the Toolkit as soon as possible and begin reviewing our guidance documents. <a href="#">Read more, including the guidance materials.</a> <a href="#">Watch the recorded workshop here.</a></p>
