Launch of the Sussex Pharmacy Workforce Website

A new digital platform has been launched to support the entire pharmacy workforce across Sussex. The <u>Sussex Pharmacy Website</u> has been developed as a central hub for news, resources, and opportunities relevant to all pharmacy sectors, providing an accessible space for professionals to stay informed and connected.

The website brings together updates, training opportunities, and workforce development initiatives under one roof. Key features include:

Sussex Institute of Medication, Education and Research (SIMER)

A dedicated page showcasing the work of SIMER, including updates, announcements,

and highlights of projects and achievements across the region.

Trainee Pharmacy Professionals

Tailored support for individuals training to become pharmacy professionals.

Information is grouped by professional group and includes details about training programmes, learning resources, course provider links, and guidance on available study sessions and peer support groups.

Post-Qualification Pharmacy Professionals

Resources for qualified staff exploring opportunities to develop their skills or return to practice. Each staff group has a dedicated page with pathways for foundation practice, advanced roles, and sector-specific development.

Training Opportunities

A comprehensive calendar of local and national training events, including Sussexfocused webinars. The section also features a **training tracker tool**, helping professionals identify opportunities aligned with their career development.

Pharmacy Career Promotion

Guidance on how to support career events across Sussex, including a live events calendar. Downloadable resources are also available, such as a Sussex Pharmacy Careers leaflet and a range of student activities designed to promote pharmacy careers.

Sussex Institute of Medicines Education and Research (SIMER)

The launch of the Sussex Institute of Medicines Education and Research (SIMER); https://www.sussex.ics.nhs.uk/professional-guidance/pharmacy/sussex-institute-of-medicines-education-and-research-simer/), is a collaboration between the University of Brighton and pharmacy teams in the ICS. The research arm of SIMER will look to form links between researchers at the university and pharmacy teams in practice with the aim of improving patient care. The conduit to form these links will be the Centre for Lifelong Health (https://www.brighton.ac.uk/clh/index.aspx).

To kick start the process Prof. Mark Yeoman Director of the Centre for Lifelong Health at the University of Brighton is keen to develop a repository that contains details of all the research that is being carried out by pharmacy teams in Sussex. Research includes undergraduate/masters projects, audits, service evaluations, clinical trials etc. Very simply if you are generating new knowledge then they would like to hear about it.

Once they have developed the repository, the plan is to make this available on the SIMER website under a keyword search so you can identify all the work being carried out in your area of interest. The university, will bring together groups of researchers and academics with the aim of coordinating the research, providing help to develop

the projects where required and providing support/advice and time to enable major funding bids to be submitted to support key projects in the area.

East Sussex Mental Health Needs Assessment Survey

East Sussex Public Health are undertaking a Mental Health Needs Assessment of the older age population (over 60 years) in East Sussex. Views are welcome from anyone working in primary care about accessing help for older people and what might help prevent mental health problems developing in older age. The survey is very brief and should take no more than 10 minutes. The results will be summarised in anonymised form within the overall needs assessment report, which will be published here. The survey will be open until **7th November 2025.**

New formulation of Rybelsus tablets

NovoNordisk has released <u>communication</u> of an impending formulation change of Rybelsus (oral semaglutide), which will eventually replace the original formulation.

This new formulation has greater bioavailability resulting in new lower strengths (1.5mg, 4mg and 9mg) being bioequivalent to the original formulation strengths (3mg, 7mg and 14mg respectively).

Both formulations will temporally co-exist on the market, this presents a risk of mix-ups resulting in overdosing and adverse events. To mitigate this, <u>a patient transition guide</u> highlights the new formulation of Rybelsus tablets replacing the original formulation; the difference between the two, as well as providing pictures of the new formulation and strengths.

Action: Clinicians are advised that where any switches are undertaken between formulations, patients are clearly advised of their new doses and that they are to continue with taking their 'new' Rybelsus tablet at a dose of ONE tablet daily.
